The Epistles of the Apostle Peter

1 Peter – written to the Christians who lived in the upper regions of Asia Minor who were being persecuted for their faith. Written between 64 – 68 AD

2 Peter – written also to the Christians in Asia Minor.

Crucified upside down on his own request. 64 – 70 AD
