Thaddaeus – the Apostle with 3 Names

Listed Among the Twelve

“Now the names of the twelve apostles are these; the first Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; *James the son of Zebedee*, and John his brother; Philip, and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the publican; James the son of Alphaeus; and Lebbeus, whose surname was Thaddeus; Simon the Canaanite; and Judas Iscariot, who also betrayed him.” Matthew 10:2

Mark 3:14

Luke 6:14 – 16 (Judas)

Lebbeus Judas Thaddeus

Lebbeus (Lebbaeus) – the heart; the courageous one Matthew 10:2

Judas – Jehovah leads; he will be confessed Matthew 10:2, Luke 6:16, John 14:22, Acts 1:13

Thaddeus (Thaddaeus) – breast child Matthew 10:2; Mark 3:18

The Son of James

Luke 6:16 – the IV and KJV read ‘brother of James’; later translations have corrected this to ‘son of James’

Which James?

James, the son of Zebedee, brother of the Apostles John

James, son of Mary, brother of Jesus

James, the son of Alphaeus, also known as James the Less
