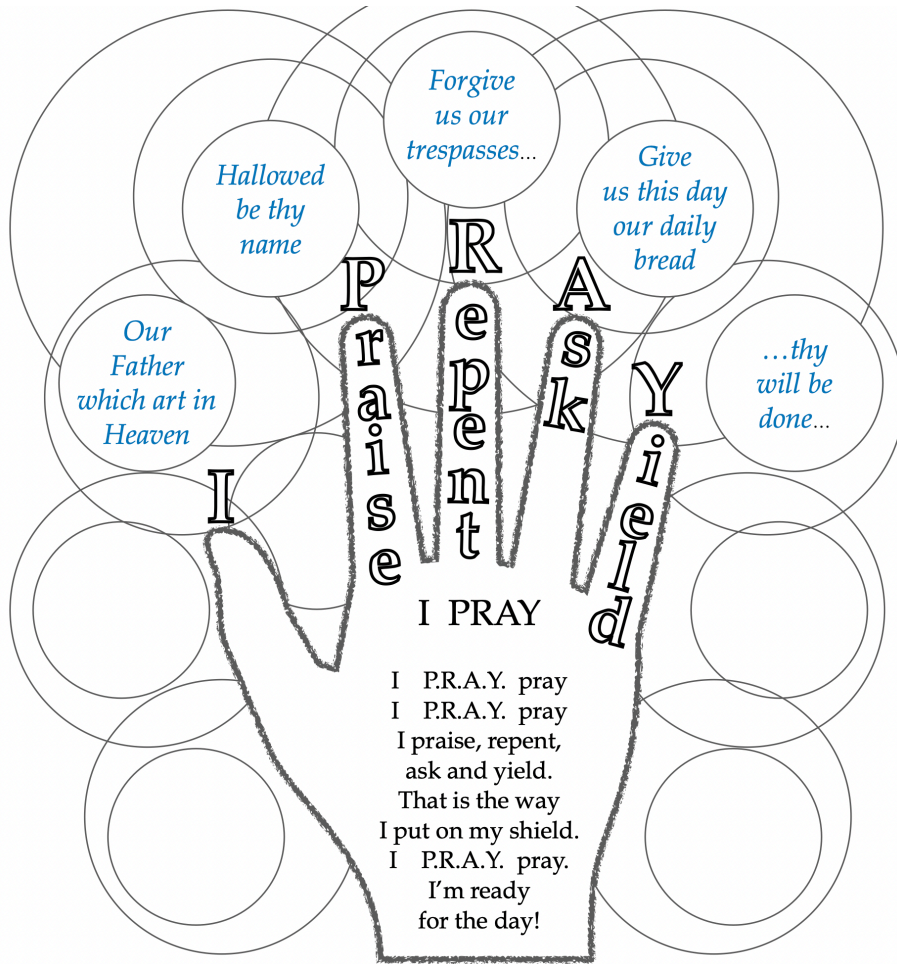


Hand of Prayer coloring page

Praise is the natural response of a life that knows God's love. If we are rooted and grounded in His love, the natural response should be to praise and thank the Lord.

- **Praise is the perfect preparation for our prayers.**
- **Praise** and worship allow the seed of God's spirit to break forth, grow stronger and sustain growth. (Isaiah 61:10-11)
- **Praise** is like water to the growing plant of God's spirit.
- **Praise** takes the focus off of ourselves and puts it on the Lord where our focus belongs. David didn't look at the huge giant. He looked at his huge God!

The Lord's Prayer

A Pattern of Prayer

As we began Kingdom Kids, the Lord brought the prayer in Matthew chapter 6 to our attention. As we studied it, we realized that it was a pattern of prayer and a chiasm or Hebrew poetry where the center idea is the most important.

Our Father who art in heaven (**I**)

Hallowed be thy name. (**P**raise)

Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth,
as it is done in heaven. (**Y**ield)

Give us this day, our daily bread (**A**sk)
and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive

those who trespass against us. (**R**epent)

And suffer us not to be led into temptation,
but deliver us from evil. (**A**sk)

For thine is the kingdom (**Y**ield)

and the glory and power for

ever and ever. Amen. (**P**raise)
