- 1 Nephi 6:17 "For behold, I have refined thee; I have chosen thee in the furnace of affliction"
- yea, and he will fulfill his word which he hath declared by them;"

God assures us of two things:

Hard times don't necessarily equal punishment- His chosen are often refined through affliction. Just because we have hard times doesn't mean we're being punished. Sometimes God chooses to refine us through affliction.

He reiterates this in vs. 44-46

"But behold, Zion hath said, The Lord hath forsaken me, and my Lord hath forgotten me; but he will shew that he hath not.

For can a woman forget her sucking child, that she should not have compassion on the son of her womb? Yea, they may forget, *yet will I not forget thee*, O house of Israel.

Behold, I have graven thee upon the palms of my hands; thy walls are continually before me."

Another confirmation found in Isaiah 44:21

"Remember these, O Jacob and Israel; for thou art my servant; I have formed thee; thou art my servant; O Israel, thou shalt not be forgotten of me."


He WILL remember YOU during the hard times





1 Nephi 5:199 "Nevertheless, I did look unto my God, and I did *praise him* all the day long; and I *did not murmur* against the Lord because of mine afflictions."

What are your thoughts about the following questions?

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- Do we find ourselves avoiding trials at all costs?
- · Do we pray for safety over God's will?
- Do we murmur when we are facing a struggle, instead of thinking big picture?

- Do we find ourselves avoiding trials at all costs?
- Of course we don't want trials, and we don't have to seek them out to prove how holy we are.
- Do we pray for **safety** over **God's will**?

 There's nothing wrong with praying for safety. But being a witness for Christ, being in God's will, seems to be the thing we should most focus on.
- Do we murmur when we are facing a struggle, instead of thinking big picture?

Some of the discussion from last week was surrounded around the idea that we choose our own path over God's instruction/commandments. The road we see looks easier or better so we take it, but in the long run it's ALWAYS worse (physically/spiritually) than doing what God wants.

There will be hardships following God's ways

(Matthew 5:13, Matthew 6:25)

but it will ALWAYS be better than another option

- To bring us closer to God

Other assurances found in chapter 6

- verse 25- Keeping the commandments brings peace
- verse 53- Those that wait (serve with diligence) for the Lord won't be ashamed (Isaiah 40:31)

1 Nephi 7:5

Wherefore, the things of which I have read, are things pertaining to things both temporal and spiritual"

- been lost and scattered on the face of the earth (6-10)
- More people of Israel will continue to be scattered because they turn their hearts against God- which includes Nephi's people (11-14)
- God will raise up a mighty nation among the Gentiles

God will do a marvelous work among the Gentiles, which will be of great worth to Nephi's seed AND to the Gentiles (17-20)

WHAT MARVELOUS WORK IS THAT? (vs 22)

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His covenants and His Gospel

- The great and abominable church will turn upon their own heads (26)
- Every nation that wars against Israel shall fall by their own devices (28-30)
- *perverts the right ways of the Lord* shall fall and become dust (31)

- of the children of men. (32)——— WHEN IS THAT GOING TO HAPPEN?!?
- be burned, because God will not allow the wicked to destroy the righteous (34-36)
- The righteous (maybe us?) don't need to fear, we will be saved, even if by fire (37). Righteous will not perish (41)

1 Nephi 7:50-53 "For the time speedily shall come, that all churches which are built up to get gain, and all those who are built up to get power over the flesh, and those who are built up to become popular in the eyes of the world, and those who seek the lusts of the flesh and the things of the world, and to do all manner of iniquity;

Yea, in fine, all those who belong to the kingdom of the devil, are they who need fear, and tremble, and quake;

They are those who must be brought low in the dust;

They are those who must be consumed as stubble:"

- The righteous will be gathered as sheep, and numbered by Him. (55-57)
- ONE FOLD; ONE SHEPHERD (58)
- Because of their righteousness, Satan will have no power (60)
- Nephi reiterates that these things will happen in the flesh and assures us they are true (63, 66)
- Those who repent and keep the commandments will dwell in safety and be saved at the last day (64, 67, 69)

We can be assured that though the fires that refine us might be tough, God's promises WILL come to pass. He will see us through.

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"O let me ne'er forget, that though the wrong seems oft so strong, God is the ruler yet. This is my Father's world, the battle is not done, Jesus who died shall be satisfied, and earth and heaven be one"
